

This will also help bring jobs to the community. All staff must have up to date certification cards required for this job. They must have a finger print clearance card, CIT 1 & 2 class certification, CPR and first aid cards, Article Nine class and certification and attend a HIPPA law class, with certification proof of completing class. All cards and classes must be kept up to date, to stay eligible for employment. Any and all Arizona State requirements required under the R6-5-5802 must be complied with, before employment is granted.

Every child and staff member must have a TB scratch test done.

Our goal is to drastically help reduce the incidences of child neglect and abuse. To achieve this goal, the "Big Hearts with Helping Hands of Arizona Organization" would like to co-ordinate prevention and awareness efforts in the State of Arizona. We sincerely feel out "City of Challenges" housing program will provide needed assistance to many neglected and abused children, pregnant teens and developmentally disabled children, along with their families.



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CITY OF CHALLENGES



Empowering abused, neglected, developmentally disabled children, homeless children, single parents with children and pregnant teens with housing, education, support services, healthy eating through gardening and ranch type skills.

This includes instructions in everyday life skills, responsibilities and animal therapy. These children benefit by learning different trades that will enrich their lives in the future.

A 501(c)3 non-profit organization
providing Multiple Community Services.

(The "City of Challenges" housing is a Foster and Group Home setting for abused, neglected, developmentally disabled children, homeless pregnant teens and homeless children. We also provide Emergency Respite care.)

The Big Hearts with Helping Hands of Arizona Organization is dedicated to aiding in child safety housing. Our mission is to provide a secure foster home / group home residence for all abused and neglected children, developmentally disabled children, homeless pregnant teenagers and homeless children.

Child neglect and abuse is a 24 hours a day, 7 days a week occurrence. This problem has risen drastically during the economic hardships. The children's ages range from newborns to high school students. Children are allowed to attend High School till the age of 21. Many of these abused and neglected children are also homeless, which increases the amount of abuse many of these children suffer.

Different types of abuse effects every child differently. It also affects these children's ability to get the learning perspectives needed for a great education. They are not able to focus their attention in school and have a tough time staying on task. It leads to bullying and negative feelings, at no fault of their own.

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These children will have access to a large range of recreational activities. This is needed to ensure good growth, responsibilities and social communication skills. Our goal is to have these children live on a ranch type facility, making it possible for them to learn about healthy eating habits and ranch type skills. This will be accomplished by having a garden to provide fresh vegetables, goats to provide fresh goats milk, chickens to provide fresh eggs and horses to provide equine therapy. This ranch type setting will provide the children a place to learn different ranch skills.

They will learn how to grow a garden and help maintain it, so that it will provide the children with fresh vegetables. They will learn about how goats can provide them with fresh goats milk for drinking and cooking. The chickens will provide them with fresh eggs to eat and use to cook meals. equine responsibilities. All of these animals will also teach them about ways they can help prevent animal abuse. weekly chores. over exertion exercises.

The equine riding therapy will help strengthen muscles autistic children do not normally use in everyday activities. This is a plus for these children and other children with muscular developmental disabilities.

The children will also have these additional recreational activities: Volley Ball, Tennis, Basket Ball, Kick Ball, Croquet, Miniature Golf, Ping Pong, a Playground and Crafting (such as crocheting, knitting, scrap booking and art). Swimming will be available to the children at a public pool location. The outdoor BBQ area will be far away from any structural areas. This will make it possible for them to have fun playing while waiting to eat a nice picnic type setting meal. These activities will help give them positive things to look forward to. This type of change in scenery will also help provide them with a fun meal setting away from their everyday indoor meals.

The children's education will be offered in several different ways, depending on their educational needs and learning levels. This includes challenging children who need to be challenged and giving extra help to those needing it the most. This can be accomplished in several different ways.

One way would be to provide on-site schooling, which can help the children that need licensed teachers for one on one learning attention. If the children are not old enough to attend school, they will stay on the residence and learn to play educational games, along with doing activities to their fullest ability.
